January: Skiing and French courses

French courses + skiing, snowboarding, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing.

A program offered by the **CUEF** and the University physical and sports activities department

This program combines the expertise of 2 components of the UGA: French courses with the CUEF and sports with the University physical and sports activities department, whose teachers are mountain enthusiasts and experts in sports education. French courses and sports include all the dimensions of an immersive learning in the heart of the Alps.

Monthly courses

French language and civilization courses

20 h of courses per week - 80 h per month (renewable) - June and July 2 h of general language courses + 2 h of specific language courses per day

Semester **courses**

University Diploma of French Studies (DUEF)

234 hours/semester (B1) 208 hours/semester (B2, C1, C2)

Public

Levels B1, B2, C1, C2.

Duration

Two sessions per year are offered: from September to December and/or from January to May.

Objectives

- Refine mastery of spoken and written language.
- Deepen specific understanding in varied areas of speciality.
- Skills targeted:

Writing and speaking skills, in understanding, production and interaction.



- Seminars, lectures, language laboratory
- Cultural activities outside the classroom (museum visits, etc.)
- Partnerships and projects with the local stakeholders to encourage integration into Grenoble life
- Students who have obtained the DUEF B2, C1 or C2 can apply to university courses offered by UGA and 15 other French ADCUEFE universities (Angers, Caen, Franche-Comté, Lille, Lyon 2, Catholic University of Lyon, Montpellier 3, Paris Est-Créteil, University of Pau and Pays de l'Adour, Perpignan, Poitiers, Reims Champagne-Ardenne, Rennes 2, Saint-Etienne, Strasbourg), without passing the DELF or DALF exams.

Semester **courses**

Day-to-day French courses

4 hours of classes per session, 15 weeks (60 hours)

Public

Levels A1+ to C1.

Duration

Two sessions per year are offered: from September to December and/or from January to May.

Objectives

- Acquire linguistic autonomy in everyday life situations (family life, school, shops, leisure activities, etc.).
- Improve your knowledge of French society through activities using different media, adapted to your level.

Evening courses (extensive courses)

2 hours of classes per week, one day per week, 10 weeks (20 hours)

University Diploma in Linguistics, French Language, Communication - DU LLFC



Public

Chinese students enrolled in the 3rd year of Benke in their home university and who can justify a CEFR level of French B1 acquired or B2 in progress.

Objectives

- Level B2 acquired.
- Master the main notions and the essential points of the disciplinary content provided in the Language Sciences and Information Communication courses.
- Understand a long speech (university) lecture) and take notes.
- Master university techniques (writing academic essays, speaking during a presentation, etc.).

- Meet university requirements: documentary research, bibliography, etc.
- Fit in a study group.
- Knowing how to deal with the different evaluation methods applied in French universities.



The continuation of studies at UGA depends on the decision issued by the diploma jury and by going through a study validation committee.

The gateway to the university diploma, objective B2 a university diploma for students in exile - DU PASS

1 or 2 semesters September - December / January - May

Public

This university diploma is intended for students in exile with an official status. holders of a secondary school diploma and presenting a project for university studies.

Students are selected by a jury, after examination of their application and a language level test certifying at least a B1 level in progress.

Objectives

This training in language, culture and university methodology, constitutes a bridge to the French university and allows to give to any student having been forced to interrupt their previous course of studies, all the linguistic, cultural and methodological prerequisites allowing them to join a career in higher education in France.

An example of medical cooperation

As part of the PAI (individualised educational plan) project, the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region supports cooperation with universities abroad. As such, the French education support program for the French-speaking medical stream at Shanghai Jiao Tong University enables a cohort of future doctors and nurses to take French classes and medical classes in French each year, at the Chinese-French-speaking Training Centre at Jiao Tong University.

Exams Tests and certifications



DELF

Diploma in French Language Studies: levels A1, A2, B1 and B2.



DALF

Diploma in Advanced French language: levels C1, C2.

These are official qualifications awarded by the French Ministry of National Education, which certifies the French skills of international candidates.

The 6 qualifications are consistent with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

At each level, the following five language-related activities are assessed:

- listening comprehension,
- spoken production,
- spoken interaction,
- written comprehension,
- writing

TCF

French Language Test

The French Language Test (TCF) consists of:

- 3 compulsory tests
- 1 complementary test

The tests consist of a total of 76 multiple-choice questions. Four possible answers are given for each question, only one of which is correct. The questions are ordered by difficulty going from level A1 to level C2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
